The committee recommend that the Solicitor of the Southern Circuit be directed to apply to George Walker, for such contracts as the Superintendent may inform him are wanting, and in case of the refusal or neglect of George Walker, to deliver said contracts, that the Solicitor do adopt such legal process as he may think most efficient and proper in the case.

He will have funds to be applied in part, but in case they should not be sufficient, desires that provision should be made for any deficiency from the appropriation heretofore made for the extension of the Columbia Canal, the contract for that work having been effected for a sum less than the amount appropriated. The Committee recommend that the Superintendent be authorized to draw from the unapplied appropriation for the extension of the Columbia Canal, so much as may be necessary to clean out the lower part of said Canal.
